Applied theatre is gaining ground worldwide in the most diverse environments, such as health, education, community. And why? Because it is an art of the bodies, individual and social bodies. And we all are a body that the theatre, conceived as a process and not a product, as action and not mere representation, puts back at the core of life. A personal and collective life that today is less and less imposed and is more and more free and therefore performative.

As social relationships are the main source of human hardship, and the wellbeing of the social body derives from the harmonisation of its parts, the theatre's elective domain of application ought to be the social body, the community. A bio-psycho-social integrated approach is therefore called upon, aimed to (per)form individuals, groups, communities and entire societies through workshops, shows, events, performances, daily and festive rites, where the protagonists are not professional players but simple people, without distinctions of age or condition.

Social theatre, considered both as an art and as a tool to per-form, transform and reform personal and collective lives, is at the core of the International Conference "Performing the Social Education, Care and Social Inclusion through Theatre" (Per-formare il sociale. Formazione, cura e inclusione sociale attraverso il teatro). The conference will focus on three aspects of social theatre: social inclusion, community involvement and political engagement; care and cure; and finally academic and vocational education. Theoretical reflection is enriched by experiential applications, thanks to a shared, interactive network of artistic and social associations active in Milan and in its metropolitan area, the **TiPiCi Network**, an acronym standing for Transformation, Participation and Community.
